STEAM ENGINEERS AND ENTREPRENEURS

Every term, we run a STEAM based Learning Journey program which requires our Year 9 students to propose solutions to a primary school that solves an existing or future issue or need, through the creative innovative use of technology. STEAM is an approach to learning that combines Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts and Mathematics together for guiding student inquiry, dialogue, and critical thinking. Many of the great innovators and entrepreneurs of this century – Mark Zuckerberg, Elon Musk, Richard Branson, to name a few, all started with an idea that they developed to solve a need or future need which may have not existed at the time. We want to instil these ideas in our students because these are the skills they will all need when they finish school, in a world filled with drones/robots, 3D printed buildings, consumer manufacturing, lab grown meat, bionic mind controlled limbs and implants, virtual reality and artificial intelligence.

We want them to be challenged and gain an awareness of what it means to interact in the real world outside the classroom, unnerving as it may be. The students started out with lessons on coding, 3D modelling and printing, and basic robotics and electronics using Arduino kits. They also participated in a one day workshop on Unity 3D game design and development run through Holmesglen Institute of Technology.

The students then visited Tucker Road Primary School to survey the primary students and staff, make observations on services or needs that need addressing or improving. They then went away, and following a defined STEAM problem solving process, analysed the survey data and identified a set of problems. From that, they chose a problem to solve, and after coming up with a range of solutions, chose one to refine, test and develop. They then developed a presentation and built prototypes from scrap materials and electronics.

The students then went back to the primary school to present their solutions à la 'Shark Tank' style. They presented in front of the entire Grade 5 and 6 cohort, staff and a panel of judges consisting of myself, a primary staff member, a primary student, and a special guest judge from industry – Alison Arandall – Digital Channel Manager at Coles Online whose role includes running similar style innovation sessions within her company.

The students came up with a range of solutions that they presented with energy, enthusiasm, and humour, with a presentation showing the process they went through that resulted with the solution and how it will solve perceived needs/problems. Solutions ranged from app operated light sensor automatic blinds that operate based on the glare/intensity of the sun light; water saving tap designs with sensors and monitoring software and an innovative RFID operated bicycle lock design. The team is planning to continue refining, developing and eventually patenting as a viable product in future (exactly the type of thinking we were hoping to encourage through this Learning Journey).

The primary students then each took turns 'investing' by placing a fake money note into a basket in front of their favourite idea/solution. The basket with the most notes were deemed People's Choice (Sheep Solutions- RFID Bicycle Lock). The judges also collated their notes to determine the overall winner based on the quality of their presentation, solution design, engagement with audience, and teamwork (Borderline Blinds – Light sensor blinds).

Overall, it was a great experience for the students and the primary school involved, who were so impressed they have expressed their interest in repeating the journey again in upcoming school terms. Congratulations to the students of Year 9 Learning Journey – Engineers and Entrepreneurs!






